FROM THE FOUNDERS

Dear Friends,

What a year it's been! Contigo closed out our second summer camp in August, our biggest ever with 66 campers, and we entered the fall doubling our full-time staff and leading a brand-new five-day-a-week teen program, a partnership between Contigo and St. Anthony of Padua parish, designed to give teens a safe place to come after school to study, pray, relax, and build healthy relationships.

We couldn't have done it without you. The generosity of our volunteers and benefactors inspires us daily, and to witness the growth and progress of our children is truly joyful.

Our first year, "Joseph" (a pseudonym, for privacy) joined our program from a non-practicing Buddhist household. His Catholic grandmother connected us to his guardians and we were happy to have him as a part of our afterschool program. When we met Joseph, his knowledge of the Faith was nonexistent and his understanding of prayer was heavily influenced by video game wizards. Day by day, at Contigo he learned more and more about Catholicism. He made friends who excitedly shared everything they knew about Jesus and our Faith traditions. His new best friend, on finding out that Joseph hadn't yet been baptized, made sure to tell him "it's not too late, don't worry—even old men can get baptized!"

When Joseph expressed desire to receive the Sacraments, we spoke with Joseph's family and connected them, along with his siblings, to the Religious Education program at St. Anthony's. After a year of hard work attending classes and researching his Confirmation saint, St. Michael the Archangel, Joseph was received into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil on March 30, 2024, surrounded by excited Contigo classmates and Mariah, as his godmother and sponsor.

Inspiring stories like Joseph's punctuate our experience at Contigo every day. Here are a few of our successes in the past year:

- More than 100 young people came through our doors for after school activities or summer camp
- Dozens experienced the outdoors as never before, hiking, kayaking, and even camping overnight in Shenandoah National Park (shoutout to the United States Park Rangers for all their help!)
- 16 Contigo members made their first communion, first penance, and/or were confirmed in the faith at the Easter Vigil Mass
- 4 teens gained life experience as Contigo interns during Contigo Summer
- Two new staff members joined our team, and we were able to provide pay increases to enable a living (if still modest) wage
- All that, plus innumerable blessings!

On a Wednesday in September we were thrilled to see 48 Contigo young people crowded into the pews at St. Anthony's for a completely voluntary holy hour before the Blessed Sacrament.

Where would these young people be if not for Contigo? Some might be hanging out in their apartment complexes, or hiding out in their apartments, alone or with siblings but without adult supervision. Others might be glued to their smartphones and the lures of social media. One of our teens told us recently that his typical screen time had been eight hours a day, but during summer camp it plunged to under three. The difference is having someplace to go, to learn, to grow, to be inspired. As some of our kids say, when we're at Contigo, "we're home."

Now as we enter our fourth year, with the after-school program back in full swing and the Teen Center just taking off, we are grateful for our accomplishments and awed by how much more there is still to do. Our teens are reveling in having a place of their own, with a coffeehouse vibe (countertops and stools for homework, a sofa for relaxing, drinks and snacks, and opportunities for prayer, discussion, mentorship, and more). But getting them there from four different area high schools is a challenge and a half. We could double attendance immediately—if only we could hire a part-time bus driver to bring them to us! We have access to a bus and we know a trustworthy driver ... now, if we could just raise the \$10,000 to make this dream come true.

Not that we aren't grateful for all we have. Our growing list of donors is a reminder that all around us are people who see the hope and potential in children whose parents are often new to this country, working multiple jobs to make ends meet, and struggling to overcome a language barrier and other challenges. At Contigo, we understand that to help the children often means helping the parents, assisting them in accessing available county and educational services, and sometimes just providing a shoulder to lean on and a safe haven for their children.

Your continued support is vital for continuing this important work. Together, we are creating a brighter future for the children and teens in our community!

PROGRAM OVERVIEW CAMP CONTIGO

This year's Camp Contigo hosted 66 children for seven fun and activity-filled weeks in June, July, and August. Monday through Friday, from 7:30am to 5:30pm, Contigo provided a safe, supervised, and enriching program, exposing our campers to art, exercise, crafts, gardening, cooking, and outdoor experiences like hiking, rock-climbing, and kayaking. Many of our children would otherwise have spent the summer unsupervised in their apartments while their parents went off to work, but instead grew in Faith, Art, Sports, Academics, and Life Skills.

All told, our campers participate in some 45 programs per week, divided into three age groups, maintaining a vibrant rotation that keeps them engaged and challenged. Campers have the opportunity to attend Eucharistic Adoration weekly and Mass daily; on Fridays, all campers attend Mass together with the rest of the parish community.

Outside time is precious, especially for children who otherwise have only limited opportunities to get into the great outdoors. Each camper spends at least one hour outdoors playing a sport. Additionally, our "farm to fork" program saw kids plant and harvest vegetables in our garden and turn them into nutritious snacks. Campers 6th grade and above have the opportunity to go on a field trip each week, which included hiking local trails, kayaking, and climbing at a rock climbing gym. In lieu of field trips, our younger campers spent additional time outdoors playing water games.

After completing the seven week camp, we led 14 rising 8th and 9th graders on a two-day camping trip to Shenandoah National Park, where they searched for salamanders, stared up into the starry night sky while a Park Ranger shared insights into astronomy, and hiked challenging trails. They even got to participate in a special Mass celebrated outdoors in Big Meadows.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW AFTERSCHOOL

While most youth programs at parishes meet once or twice per week, Contigo Youth Club's afterschool program welcomes our kids each weekday, providing a safe place for indoor and outdoor free play, enriching programming, faith-filled activities, help with homework, and positive relationships with dedicated adults. Engaging our youth frequently and consistently allows us to build strong, trust-filled developmental relationships with our members, encouraging growth as well-rounded individuals.

Here is where Contigo is truly different. **A week at Contigo Youth Club provides more hours with trusted adults and like-minded peers that an entire calendar year of conventional parish youth programs.** Perhaps that's why the *Arlington Catholic Herald* wrote that Contigo "has a new approach to youth ministry entirely."¹

As in the summer, club members cycle through multiple programs divided by age and gender, experiencing a different series of programs each afternoon. Every eight weeks a new set of programs are introduced, ensuring a variety of activities and opportunities, while also setting aside time for homework, tutoring, and academic and spiritual enrichment. Holy days are celebrated, and the children are exposed to the rich cultural traditions of the Catholic Faith. In the fall, we celebrate All Saints Day, make an Advent wreath, and celebrate St. Nicholas; in the spring, we have a Living Way of the Cross, a Holy Thursday Meal, attend the diocesan Chrism Mass, and celebrate Our Lady's Birthday. And all year long we celebrate saints' Feast Days.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW BELOVED WEDNESDAYS

Contigo's "BeLoved Wednesday" program opens the Club to visitors, especially those unable to commit to our full program. Each Wednesday, our regular afterschool members welcome visitors to our various activities and spiritual nourishment, including prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

Some have joined the program full-time after just a single visit! BeLoved Wednesday participants take part in Lectio Divina, a meditative and prayerful reading of Scripture, deepening their understanding of God's Word and increasing familiarity with the Bible through a new way of prayer, then attend Adoration before taking a break for hot chocolate and, afterward, homework help.

During Holy Week, BeLoved Wednesday participants are invited to immerse themselves more deeply in the life of the Church. We took a field trip to the Diocesan Chrism Mass to witness the consecration of the holy oils, the presbyterate's renewal of priestly promises, and to see first hand the unity of our diocese. We hosted our own traditional Seder Meal to better share the roots of our faith and understand the significance of the Last Supper. Then we experience the Via Crucis, a reenactment of the Way of the Cross, experiencing in a visceral way the final steps of Christ before the Crucifixion.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Contigo Youth Club's High School Internship Program provides opportunities for high school students to develop essential professional skills, grow in their faith, and contribute meaningfully to the community.

High Schoolers are typically referred from the parish Religious Education program. Interested teens complete a thorough written application, an interview, and reference checks. Following selection, they participate in a week-long training experience before beginning work for the summer.

Our interns gain hands-on experience in planning and running programs. They are actively involved in every stage of program development, from initial brainstorming sessions to execution and evaluation. This process teaches them project management, problem-solving, and teamwork, as they collaborate to create enriching activities for the younger members of our club. Their involvement throughout the process gives them an understanding of the complexities of program logistics and the importance of attention to detail.

Being a role model is another vital aspect of our internship program. Our high school interns aren't just hired help, but instead become examples and leaders to the younger children, demonstrating positive behavior, leadership qualities, and a strong work ethic. They learn to set a good example and that by being actively engaged with the kids, they can inspire and motivate the younger members. This mentorship role reinforces their sense of responsibility and underscores the impact they have on others.

Most important, the Contigo Youth Club's high school internship program enriches their personal growth and leadership abilities, setting them on the road to future professional careers. We are proud of the achievements of our interns this year and are committed to continuing to provide a robust and transformative program that empowers the next generation of leaders.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW PARISH CONNECTION

Contigo Youth Club is blessed to be resident at St. Anthony of Padua parish, where we are an independent provider of Parish youth activities. One of our great pleasures has been to help families whose children have not yet received the sacraments. Contigo has assisted families' enrollment in the parish's Religious Education program and assisted numerous children in receiving the Sacraments. This year, 16 Contigo members received Baptism, First Communion, and/or Confirmation, and 1 member was received into the church at the Easter Vigil!

Our commitment goes beyond the basics. We invite children to participate in and volunteer for church events, fostering in them a sense of community and service. Contigo members take part in the parish Corpus Christi Procession, bringing Christ to the streets and instilling in them a sense of belonging and responsibility.



PROGRAM OVERVIEW OTHER PROJECTS

Monthly Food Distribution

In partnership with St. James Social Outreach's Food Distribution, we provided 6 Contigo families with groceries each month.

School Events

In partnership with St. Anthony Catholic School, Contigo worked with students at all grade levels to participate in the school assemblies and the parish's school year theme: "Whatsoever you do for them you do for Me," Matthew 25:40.

Spiritual Response Team (SRT)

Contigo staff continues to actively participate in St. Anthony's Spiritual Response Team, which spearheads initiatives to prayerfully and actively respond to issues within the parish boundaries, combatting gangs, human trafficking, violence, drug abuse and addiction. The team meets monthly to work and pray the rosary.

Juan Diego Fútbol Club

Contigo staff began making connections with high school teens by hosting soccer training and competitions at the parish.

At Contigo Youth Club, we take pride in ensuring that every dollar is responsibly allocated to maximize our impact. By closely monitoring our expenses and income, we ensure that our resources are invested directly in support of our programs and initiatives.

We are regularly finding ways to lower costs. This year, we replaced our printer with one that saves us hundreds per year in ink costs, and switched to an insurance company that specifically serves church youth programs, allowing us to avoid unnecessary coverage and save thousands of dollars. Moving forward, we plan on transitioning our current donors to a new donation management platform, which will eliminate all donor management software expenses.

Our board of directors has played an important role in strengthening our financial foundation. Through their extensive networks and expertise, they have connected us with generous benefactors and valuable resources. These connections have not only provided us with consistent financial support but have also opened doors to new opportunities for collaboration and growth. The board's dedication and proactive approach have been instrumental in securing the funding necessary to sustain and expand our programs.

Thanks to these combined efforts, Contigo Youth Club has achieved stable finances that position us for future growth. We remain committed to maintaining this high standard of financial integrity and to being responsible stewards of the resources entrusted to us, as we look forward to another year of positive impact.
